






Where Does It Go?







Compost

"Browns"

- Wood Chips
- Straw
- Dry Leaves
- Sawdust

"Greens"

- Nut Shells
- Tea Bags
- Egg Shells
- Coffee Bags/ filter paper
- Fresh Grass Clippings
- Wood Ash
- Plant Trimmings
- Plant Remains
- Fruit & Veggie Scraps

Always remember to water your compost!



Recycling

- Newspaper, Magazines, Catalogues
- Aluminum Containers
- Glass Containers
- PFT or #1 Plastic Containers
- HDPE or #2 Plastic Containers
- LPDE #4 Plastic Containers & Lids
- PP or #5 Plastic Containers
- #7 Plastic Containers
- Steel Containers

Please check with your recycling brochure for specific examples on what #1, #2, #4, #5, and #7 plastic containers are.

Please do not recycle #3 or #6 plastic.

#3 Plastic: shampoo bottles, condiment bottles, teething rings, etc.
Also known as PVC

#6 Plastic: Styrofoam

Garbage

Some examples of garbage are:

- Aluminum foil, soiled
- Broken glass (wrapped)
- Household Items
- Carbon paper
- Cloth items
- Coffee cups, disposable
- Diapers, disposable
- Frozen juice cans
- Latex gloves
- Light bulbs
- Motor oil containers
- Packaging, non-recyclable
- Plastic wrap, soiled
- Plastics, non-recyclable
- Potato chip bags
- Styrofoam
- Toothpaste tubes
- Toys, broken
